Dear Sirs and Madam:

Minister of the Interior of the Republic of Mexico

We, members of the InterReligious Task Force, are deeply concerned for the safety of **Yesica Sánchez Maya**, a lawyer who works for the Mexican League for the Defense of Human Rights (LIMEDDH), and **Aline Castellanos Jurado**, a leading member the Committee for Parliamentary Dialogue and Equality. They have been documenting and publicizing human rights violations that have taken place in Oaxaca since the beginning of widespread protests in June and are now facing arrest on charges which are baseless. We fear that if these women are arrested they could face the same ill treatment and torture that has happened to other human rights activists taken into custody during the Oaxaca protests.

A warrant for the arrest of one of the women was issued by a judge in Etla, near Oaxaca. The charges relate to the occupation of public broadcaster Corporación Oaxaquena de Radio y Televisión, also known as Canal 9, by protesters on August 1, who were evicted by the police in November. Yesica Sanchez and Aline Castellanos categorically deny involvement in any offenses. Human rights defenders have played a key role in bringing to public attention human rights violations including the fabrication of criminal charges against protesters. We believe that leveling false charges against these two women may be intended as reprisal for their work.

We previously wrote to you on November 21, 2006 protesting the acts of intimidation against LIMEDDH and urged you to thoroughly investigate them. **We again strongly urge that you**

- ensure that Yesica Sanchez and Aline Castellanos are protected from any form of torture or ill-treatment;
- guarantee their safety and their right to continue their human rights work without any restrictions or fear of reprisals, as set out in the UN Declaration on the Right and Responsibility of Individuals, Groups and Organs of Society to Promote and Protect Universally Recognised Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms:
- conduct an investigation into the misuse of the judicial system to obstruct the legitimate work of human rights defenders.
