Dear Sir:

We are writing to urge you to immediately release Marcelino and Leonardo Miranda, community leaders of Montaño Verde in the municipality of Gracias, Department of Lempira, who are in prison under an unjust 25 year sentence. We have been following their case for two years and have written letters about it to the President of Honduras and other officials on May 21, 2003; November 1, 2003 and January 12, 2004. We are very aware of the many irregularities in due process and abuse of human rights that have occurred. These are all in the context of the struggle of the Civic Council of Grassroots and Indigenous Organizations of Honduras (COPINH) to achieve recognition of their indigenous territories and to obtain community land titles.

The Miranda brothers have been brutally beaten and dragged to Gracias prison where they have been tortured and kept jailed under fabricated charges. This use of the Honduran justice and penal systems as instruments of repression is absolutely unconscionable.

We expect to hear from you with news that the Miranda brothers have been released. Thank you for your prompt attention to this urgent matter.
