Dear Sirs,

We are alarmed at specific new threats against the lives of the **Rev. Milton Mejia** and **Mauricio Avilez** of the Ecumenical Church Network of Colombia. The network has documented these threats in an official report delivered in Bogotá during the week of Feb. 7, 2006.

Religious leaders who work with Colombians displaced by violence say millions of internal refugees are defenseless against paramilitary and guerrilla militias and government forces. In a country with virtually no social safety net, the poorest people turn to the church for help with shelter, food and medical care. Responding to their needs is increasingly risky.

During a 2004 incarceration and interrogation of Mauricio Avilez, the Presbyterian church learned that its Barranquilla headquarters was under constant surveillance and that ring-wing forces were trying to link the church to the leftist guerrilla movement. This is outrageous.

These leaders are defending the democratic and constitutional rights of victims of violence in Colombia. As their record of public service proves, they are committed to non-partisan, non-violent, life-affirming works of truth, faith and peace. Their lives are committed to overcoming violence and creating more space for the empow erment of civic institutions.

We strongly urge that you

- take action to guarantee the safety of Rev. Milton Mejia and Mauricio Avilez and members of the Ecumenical Network of Colombia in accordance with their wishes;
- recognize the right of religious organizers to carry out their legitimate w ork w ithout any fear of reprisals, as stated by the United Nations
- Take decisive action to confront and dismantle paramilitary groups operating in the area and to break their links with the security forces, in line with repeated UN recommendations.
