Dear Sirs:

We, members of the InterReligious Task Force, are seriously concerned for the safety and welfare of members of the displaced Wayuu community of **Bahía Portete** in the Alta Guajira region of La Guajira, the far northeastern Caribbean coastal department of Colombia. On November 23, the paramilitary group **Contrainsurgencia Wayuu**, under command of **"Pablo**," killed **Chichi Epinayu**, age 35, and kidnapped **Julian Epinayu**, age 68, whose fate is not yet known. A third victim, **Masparray Epinayu**, survived, although he is in serious condition with bullet wounds.

This is the most recent example of the ongoing victimization of the Wayuu people. On November 8, a mercenary, Jorge, age 40, confessed in a public hearing in Barranquilla, in coastal Atlántico Department, that his team committed five massacres, including the Bahia Portete Massacre that took the lives of 12 indigenous Wayuu in April 2004. He told how the massacre had been planned in collaboration with a member of the Cartagena Battalion. His confession confirms that the activities of the paramilitaries throughout the Atlantic coast are at the service of multinational companies and national monopolies that have appropriated lands and ports for the development of their economic projects. The region's economy is dominated by the largest open pit coal mine in the world, El Cerrejon Zona Norte, whose construction and operations have resulted in the displacement of hundreds of Wayuu and Afro-Colombian families.

The Wayuu community of Bahia Portete has been denouncing these acts for years through their community spokespeople whom the paramilitaries, the government and multinational companies accuse of being collaborators in the insurgency, kidnappers and thieves.

As a result of our concern for the safety and welfare of the Wayuu people, specifically those in the Bahía Portete community in Alta Guajira, we strongly urge you to:

- form a commission consisting of the Defensoría del Pueblo, the Attorney General of Colombia, representatives of the Organization of American States (OAS), the National Commission on Reparation and Reconciliation (CNRR), United Nations (UN) and the National Indigenous Organization of Colombia (ONIC), to go to the area, investigate the killings and report publicly on its findings;
- take effective action, as deemed appropriate to members of the Bahía Portete community, to protect them and ensure that they can safely live on their legitimate ancestral lands;
- take decisive action, in line with repeated UN recommendations, to confront and dismantle paramilitary groups operating in the region and to break their links with the security forces.
