Dear Sirs:

We, members of the InterReligious Taskforce on Central America, are extremely concerned for the safety of human rights defender **Aida del Rosario López Cordero**, Coordinator of the Women's Defense Office at the Human Rights Ombudsman's Office in Quiché Department. She has been involved in attempts to bring two police officers to justice for the rape of an indigenous woman, Juana Méndez, while she was in police custody in 2005. Aida Lopez has been threatened and intimidated since the trial of one of the police officers began on February 18.

She received a threatening phone call on the evening of the second hearing of the trial of the police officer on February 25. On the night of March 2, "VC3 M18," the name of a street gang in Guatemala, was spraypainted on the walls of her house. They also broke the lights at the entrance to her house and the bulbs of the lampposts on the street outside. On March 6 at 4:24 pm, she received a call on her cell phone from a man who told her he was an inmate of a Guatemala City prison and then hung up. She has never had any contact with inmates of the prison, and her mobile number is known only by her relatives and close friends.

We remind you of the right of human rights defenders to carry out their activities without any restrictions or fear of reprisals, as set out in the UN Declaration on the Rights and Responsibilities of Individuals, Groups and Institutions to Promote and Protect Universally Recognized Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms.

We strongly urge you to:

- order a prompt, thorough and impartial investigation into the threats and intimidation of Aida de Rosario Lopez Cordero and bring those responsible to justice;
- take immediate and effective measures to guarantee her safety, in strict accordance with her own wishes.
