Dear Sir:

We are gravely concerned for the safety of the fifteen volunteers for the Guatemalan Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) who work with youths at risk of joining gangs. On the night of August 10, three YMCA volunteers – **Eliazar Hernandez, Mario Gamez** and **Juan Navarro** – went to the house of Eliazar Hernandez about 9pm after finishing work at the YMCA office. Late that night, after receiving a phone call, they left the Hernandez house, telling others present that they would be back soon. The three young men's bodies were found by farm workers early the next morning on a farm approximately 10 km south of Amatitlan, Guatemala Department. They had been cut with machetes, severely beaten and then killed by a single shot to the head.

We are aware that the pattern observed in these murders has been repeated over and over in Guatemala. We are also aware that, according to police records, 5,781 people were murdered in Guatemala in 2007 and yet less than 2% of these killings resulted in a conviction. In February 2007 UN Special Rapporteur on extrajudicial, summary or arbitrary executions issued a report criticizing Guatemala for fostering impunity for killings and noted that the police are involved in killings of those thought to be "socially unacceptable."

## We therefore urge that you

- order an immediate and thorough investigation into the killings of the three YMCA volunteers, publish the results and bring those responsible to justice;
- ensure that immediate measures are taken to guarantee the safety of the 15 remaining YMCA members, in strict accordance with their wishes;
- refrain from making any statements about the killings or the victims which could prejudice the investigation.
