Dear Sirs:

We are outraged at the harassment and ill treatment of **members of the Peten Distributor Employees Union (SITRAPETEN)**. In early May, a group of employees of Agua Salvavidas, a purified water distribution company owned by the Castillo Brothers Corporation, was illegitimately fired. SITRAPETEN was formed in February 2007 to strengthen employees' bargaining position in demanding compliance with Guatemalan labor laws. After being rejected on five separate occasions by the Ministry of Labor, it was officially approved in May of this year.

On May 3, the company declared bankruptcy and insisted that union members resign. Non-union members were told that they would be transferred to other companies. Legal procedures for declaring bankruptcy were not followed by the company. SITRAPETEN members refused to sign the letter of resignation and set up an encampment outside the company's headquarters to defend their right to organize, protest their dismissal and demand reinstatement. All SITRAPETEN's attempts to draw attention to their situation and defend their right to organize have been met with harassment, intimidation and violence. Members have been physically attached by security guards, received intimidating phone calls and have seen cars with tinted windows and without license plates circling their encampment.

We are aware that the treatment of SITRAPETEN members reflects a national pattern of rising attacks against unions in Guatemala. **We therefore urge that you**

- act to guarantee the safety of the SITRAPETEN affiliates and other trade unionists facing threats and intimidation:
- protect the right to free association and other labor rights as stipulated in Guatemalan and international law;
- comply with commitments to uphold labor rights standards as stipulated in the DR_CAFTA
 negotiated with the United States and the association agreement between Central America and the
 European Union.
