Dear Sirs:

We are very concerned for the safety of Father Antonio Rodríguez López who works in San Salvador on rehabilitation projects with former gang members and on prevention projects with young people at risk of joining gangs. On September 5 a reliable source told him he was at risk of being killed. The following day another source confirmed the information. On September 7, as Father Antonio walked toward his office, the driver of a parked car rolled down his window, said "They're going to kill you" and drove off. Father Antonio reported the incident to the police.

Because gang violence is such a serious problem, membership in a gang was made a criminal offence in 2011. In March 2012, a truce was brokered between two of the country's biggest gangs and government authorities. Although the truce has allegedly contributed to a decrease in the numbers of unlawful killings, several human rights groups have observed that before the truce the government did not consult with those who work on rehabilitation and prevention programs for gang members. A week before the threats against him, Father Antonio had publicly criticized the truce because he feels that the truce does not deal with gang members' rehabilitation.

Because we think the death threats are a consequence of this criticism, we **strongly urge** that you

- order an independent, thorough and impartial investigation into the threats against Father Antonio Rodr: guez López, publish the results, and bring those responsible to justice;
- take immediate steps to provide appropriate protection to Father Antonio Rodríguez López, in accordance with his wishes.
