Dear Sirs:

We are extremely concerned about the continuing mass death threats to journalists and employees of media outlets from the paramilitary organization Black Eagles-Capital Block (*Bloque Capital-Águilas Negras*).

On November 30 and December 1, Black Eagles-Capital Block made threats to TV stations *Canal Capital* and *Telesur*, to Agency of Reporters without Borders (*Agencia de Reporteros Sin Fronteras*), and to **Nelson Armesto Echavez**, the creator of the news program *Patio Bonito Al Día*.

Colombia continues to be a dangerous place for journalists. The 2014 Press Freedom Index by Reporters Without Borders (a Paris-based organization, not related to the aforementioned Agency of Reporters without Borders in Colombia), ranks Colombia 126th out of 180 countries. Reporters Without Borders reports at least 56 journalists killed in Colombia since 2000, making it one of the deadliest countries for media personnel. The organization calls Black Eagles one of Colombia's leading "Predators of Press Freedom."

Even though the Paris-based Reporters Without Borders was not named in the threat, the organization is concerned for the safety of its correspondent in Colombia, **Fabiola León Posada**.

Because of a recent surge in death threats by the Black Eagles (cf our letter of December 23), we **strongly urge** that you

- investigate the threats made against *Canal Capital*, *Telesur*, *Agencia de Reporteros Sin Fronteras*, and to **Nelson Armesto Echavez**, publish the results, and bring those responsible to justice;
- provide protection measures to Nelson Armesto Echavez and Fabiola León Posada, in strict accordance with their wishes;
- ensure that any attacks on journalists do not go unpunished;
- take action to dismantle paramilitary forces and break any links between them and the security forces, in line with repeated UN recommendations.
