Dear Sirs:

We are horrified at the brutal murder by unknown persons of environmental defender Luis Fernando Ayala, age 16, in the municipality of Concepción del Sur in Santa Bárbara Department. He was reported missing on February 19. His mutilated body was found on February 20 with his hands missing and multiple signs of torture.

Luis Fernando Ayala was a member of the Environmental Movement of Santa Bárbara (*MAS, Movimiento Ambientalista Santabarbarense*), in the municipality of Gualala, Department of Santa Bárbara. Through his involvement with MAS, Luis Fernando struggled against the installation of megaprojects by mining and hydroelectric companies. Several communities in Gualala have been struggling for more than three years against a concession granted to a gypsum mining company for an indefinite period in the village of Arenales; Luis Fernando Ayala was active in this struggle. He was also active in the wave of pro-democracy demonstrations that have taken hold across the country since the disputed presidential election in November 2017. He and many other young people have been unjustly criminalized by the Military Police of the Public Order (PMOP) for their participation in several peaceful protests.

Luis Fernando's horrific murder highlights the systematic campaign of public, verbal and physical attacks against human rights defenders in Honduras, which has been exacerbated in the current context of social and political crisis since the November 2017 election. In the first two months following the election, there were 30 killings of human rights defenders (21 at the hands of the PMOP), and at least 232 people injured and 1085 people arrested.

Environmental and human rights defenders are currently at great risk. Therefore, we **strongly urge** that you

- carry out an immediate, independent, exhaustive, effective and impartial investigation into the murder of Luis Fernando Ayala, publish the results, and bring those responsible to justice;
- end all types of harassment and criminalization against all human rights defenders in Honduras and take immediate measures to ensure their safety and physical and psychological integrity;
- ensure the application of the provisions of the Declaration on Human Rights Defenders, adopted by the UN General Assembly on December 9, 1998.
